

What is the CCB IPA?

The Community Care of Brooklyn Independent Practice Association (CCB IPA) is an integrated network of health and social services partners committed to improving the health and well-being of diverse communities across Brooklyn, keeping care local wherever and whenever possible. The CCB IPA is a legal entity that contracts with a variety of health care providers and other parties (the “network”) to enter into contracts with third-party payors. Leveraging infrastructure developed to support the DSRIP program, the CCB IPA will:

- Negotiate value-based payment (VBP) contracts
- Integrate a high-quality network of primary, specialty, and community-based care with shared clinical protocols
- Expand effective care coordination and communication methods supported by population health data analytics
- Address social and economic factors that impact health and well-being
- Develop and engage a highly qualified, empathetic health care workforce

What are the benefits?


- Membership in a Brooklyn-based network of engaged partners integrated via shared clinical protocols, streamlined referral and feedback processes, and a commitment to keeping care local
- Access to quality improvement, care coordination, and practice enhancement services; workforce training; and population health data analytics
- Participation in VBP contracts to earn shared savings with certain payors as soon as March 2018
- No financial investment required to join!

What is Value-Based Payment (VBP)?

The goals of VBP are to enhance the delivery of quality care, improve the health of patients, and lower costs of rendering care. A VBP approach transitions from payment based on the number of services provided to a patient (quantity) to a payment system that rewards partners for keeping patients healthy (quality + costs). If targeted levels of quality and reductions in cost are achieved, there are opportunities for partners to receive a share of the savings generated. How does contracting work?

Signing a Participation Agreement with the CCB IPA would enhance, not replace, your direct contract with a payor. The CCB IPA would enter into a VBP contract with a payor, which would set quality and spending targets for the network.



Demonstrated Success

The CCB IPA has been developed to continue the progress made by the Community Care of Brooklyn (CCB) Performing Provider System (PPS) led by Maimonides Medical Center in the New York State Delivery System Reform Incentive Payment (DSRIP) program. The PPS network is comprised of over 1,000 provider organizations and more than 4,000 practitioners, supported by a consensus-based governance model. Since its formation in 2015, the PPS has demonstrated success in enhancing primary care, improving care transitions, engaging with communities, and supporting workforce development.
